Learn Your Voting Options

It's your future so you've got to Vote For It! The Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk has everything you need to cast your ballot in the **2024 General Election**. Voting has never been faster or easier!

Discover your voting options and make your plan to vote today.

How can I register to vote?

The fastest and easiest way to register to vote is to visit [PLAN.LAVOTE.GOV](https://plan.lavote.gov). If you miss the deadline to vote by mail, don't worry! You can register at any Vote Center when you come to cast your ballot in-person.

What is the registration deadline to receive a Vote by Mail ballot?

If you are voting for the first time, are new to L.A. County, or if you have moved recently, you must register to vote by October 21, 2024 to receive a Vote by Mail ballot. And you can always vote in person too.

What are my voting options?

The L.A. County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk provides various voting options to best fit your needs. These include:

1. Vote by Mail.

Every registered voter in L.A. County will be mailed a ballot for the General Election starting **October 3rd**. Just fill it out, sign the Return Envelope, and mail it back as soon as you receive it.

2. Drop Your Ballot at a nearby Drop Box.

Avoid the lines and take advantage of any one of L.A. County's 400 Official Ballot Drop Box locations. Find a Ballot Drop Box close to you at [PLAN.LAVOTE.GOV](https://plan.lavote.gov).

3. Visit any Vote Center beginning Saturday, October 26th.

You're never far from a convenient place to cast your ballot! L.A. County voters can drop off their Vote by Mail ballot or vote in person at any Vote Center. Find a Vote Center near you at [PLAN.LAVOTE.GOV](https://plan.lavote.gov) and make your plan to vote before Election Day.

When should I turn in my Vote by Mail ballot?

Don't wait to return your ballot! Drop your vote in the mail or in a Ballot Drop Box on your way to work, school, or the gym. Send your ballot by **Saturday, October 26th** to make sure your vote is counted on Election Night, so you can be sure to get the results quickly!

How do I track my Vote by Mail ballot?

It's free and easy to track your vote every step of the way by using the [Where's My Ballot?](#) tool. After you return your ballot, you will receive email or text notifications when it is received at the Registrar's office so that you know it is being counted.
